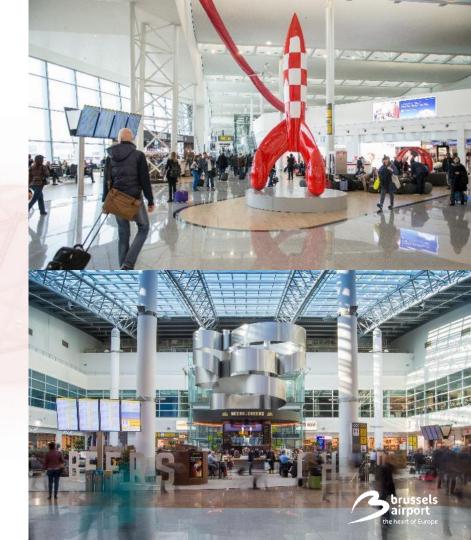

Pro-active management, ensure efficiency, and facilitate communication to coordinate aircraft, passengers, baggage and accessibility





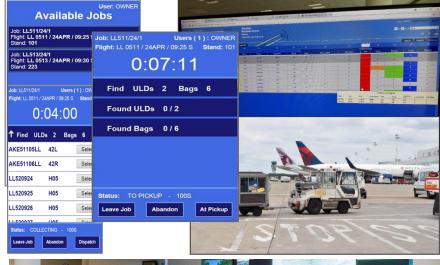




Airport Operations Plan

Immigration planning, check-in desk configuration, reclaim belts, actual passenger forecast, winter operations, transfer flows, bag tracking, bussing, PRM..

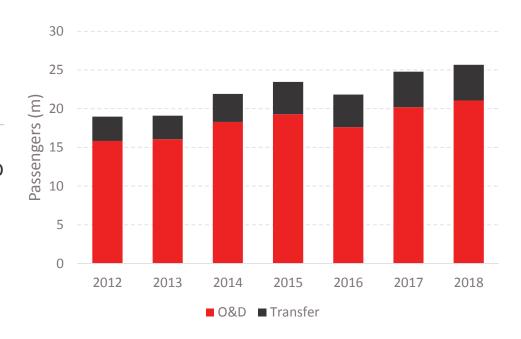




BRUSSELS AIRPORT PASSENGER TRAFFIC

Continuing growth in number of O&D passengers showing the strength of the Belgian travel market



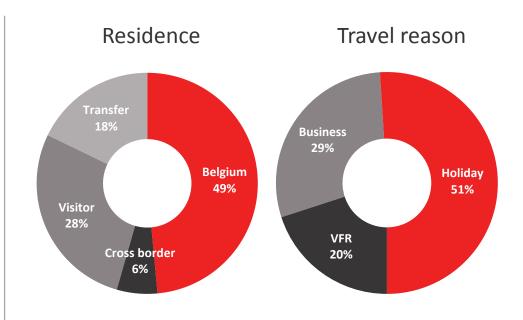

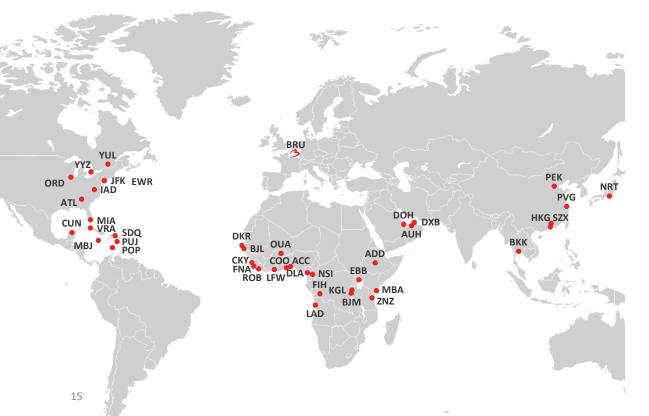








LONG HAUL NETWORK 2019





































PREFERRED CARGO HUB

7th largest regular cargo airport in Europe and pharmaceutical specialist: 730,000 tonnes cargo

One third of cargo is transported as **belly freight** on (long haul) passenger flights

3 GROWING DEMAND FOR TRAVEL BETWEEN BELGIUM & COLOMBIA

BELGIUM – COLOMBIA O&D

Demand for travel between Belgium and Colombia continues to grow in 2018: close to 22,000 one-way passengers

Continued growth of **indirect flows** as more indirect options become available

Ground Leakage to neighbouring airports represents 26% of market (PoS BE), as KLM & Air France increase offer

CALCULATION MODEL: GROUND LEAKAGE

Thanks to **Belgium**'s strategic location in the heart of Western Europe, travellers have a choice of airports to use. Brussels Airport is located closest to Brussels city, but alternative airports include AMS, CDG, DUS and FRA.

When calculating **O&D demand** from & to Belgium, only taking into account traffic from & to BRU is an **underestimation** of true demand

"Ground leakage" is calculated based on Sabre MIDT data (point of sales = Belgium)



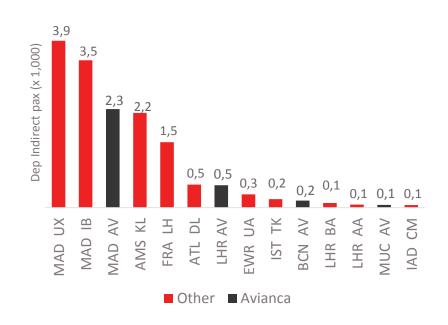


BRUSSELS – COLOMBIA INDIRECT FLOWS (2018)

By far the largest indirect flows from Brussels Airport to Colombia are on **Air Europa**, followed by **Iberia** & **Avianca**

Stats do not include ground leakage, so KLM & Air France market shares are underestimated

Connections from BRU onto Avianca flights to Colombia flow mainly over MAD

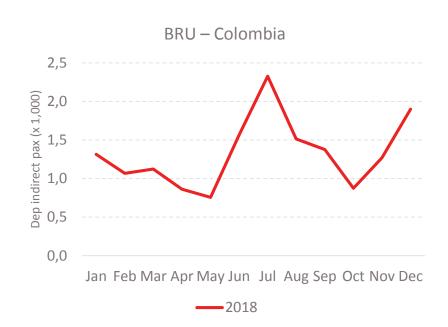




BRUSSELS – COLOMBIA SEASONALITY

Seasonality shows peak departure month from BRU in July and secondary departures peak in December

Ground Leakage not included in graph



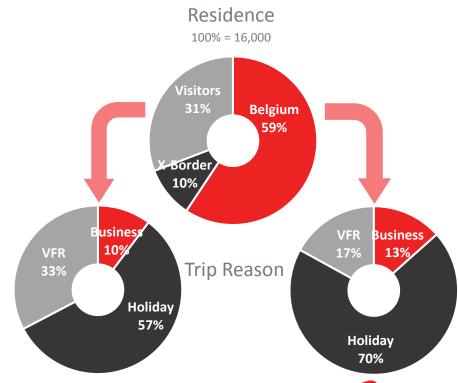


BRUSSELS – COLOMBIA PASSENGER PROFILE (2018 DATA)

Profile of passengers travelling between Brussels Airport and Colombia (indirect flows) (source: Brussels Airport surveys)

Dominated by traffic **outbound** of the BRU catchment area (outbound flows 69%)

Share of indirect passengers traveling for **business** reasons is 12%





BELGIUM – COLOMBIA MARKET SHARE BY AIRLINE

Table shows **share of passengers by marketing airline** for tickets sold in Belgium for departure to Colombia. Based on Sabre MI

Avianca share has decreased significantly: now 8% of tickets sold in Belgium. Expected to rise again in 2019 as new Munich route offers new indirect Avianca option

Table shows the strength of **Air France** & **KLM** in the Belgian market (33% market share), in addition to the announced JV with **Air Europa**.

BELGIUM – BOGOTA O&D

Total O&D of more than **14,000 one-way** passengers in 2018

Indirect flows over Madrid, Frankfurt & Amsterdam

Share of **Ground Leakage** even higher than on overall Colombia market: represents 30% of market (Sabre MIDT data for Point-of-Sales Belgium)

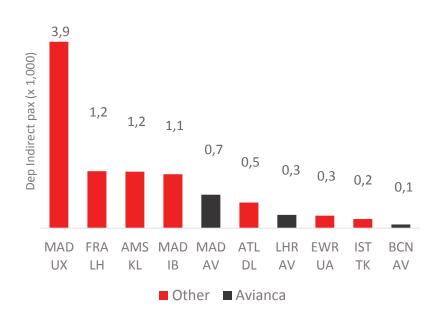


BRUSSELS – BOGOTA INDIRECT FLOWS (2018)

Top 3 indirect flows from Brussels Airport to Bogota are on Air Europa, Lufthansa and KLM

Stats do not include ground leakage, so KLM & Air France market shares are underestimated

Connections from BRU onto Avianca flights to Bogota flow mainly over MAD & LHR



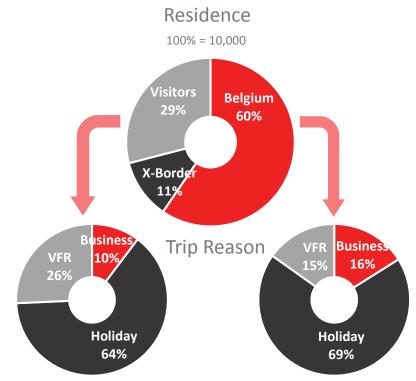


BRUSSELS – BOGOTA PASSENGER PROFILE (2018 DATA)

Profile of passengers travelling between Brussels Airport and Bogota (indirect flows) (source: Brussels Airport surveys)

Well-balanced directionality, with strong inbound flows (54%)

Of the indirect passengers travelling from Brussels Airport to Bogota, 14% is travelling for **business** reasons.



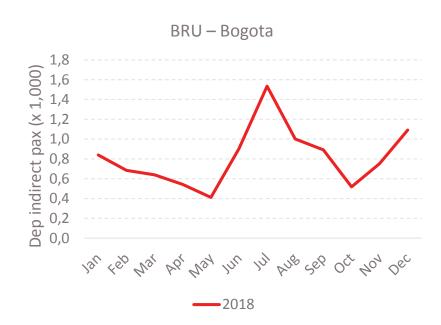


BRUSSELS – BOGOTA SEASONALITY

Seasonality shows a distinctive **departures peak** from BRU in July & December

Solid year round demand, even outside peak months proves potential for year round nonstop flights

Ground Leakage not included in graph





BOGOTA... AND BEYOND

A new Avianca direct service from BRU to Bogota with convenient connections to other cities in Colombia is expected to significantly **stimulate demand** on 1-stop itineraries

Outside of Bogota, most significant demand to **Medellin, Cali** and **Cartagena**

LARGE MARKET FOR TRAVEL TO SOUTH AMERICA

Direct service from BRU to Bogota can also serve attractive **6th freedom markets** to other Latin American countries such as, Ecuador, Peru Chile or Panama

Unserved by direct flights, a convenient connection at BOG will immediately capture significant market share

Market for travel between Belgium and Latin American countries remains unstimulated by direct flights

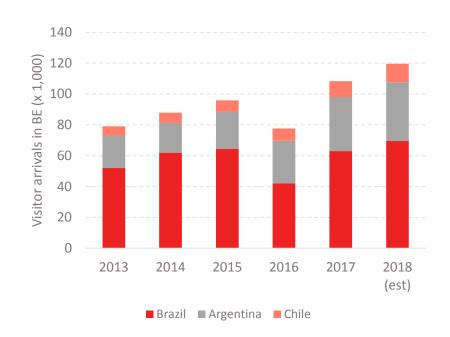

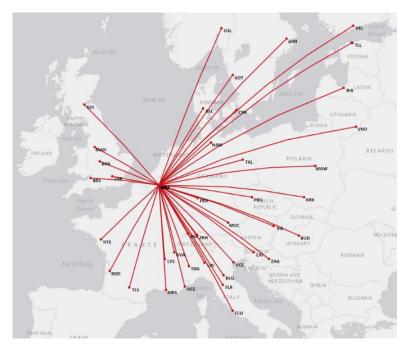


CONNECTIVITY BEHIND BRU

JOINTLY ATTRACTING PAX FROM THE NETHERLANDS

4 DETAILED SIMULATION

BOGOTA – BRUSSELS: UNCONSTRAINED SIMULATION

Proven **simulation** tool allows us to estimate demand and apply expected market share for each flow

Point-to-point BOG - BRU

Beyond BOG: easy connections from BRU via BOG to cities in Colombia and beyond

Behind BRU: connections on partner airlines to other cities in Northern/Western Europe

"Bridge" flows connecting in both BRU and BOG

Market shares of Behind & Beyond markets based on AV's MUC-BOG flight

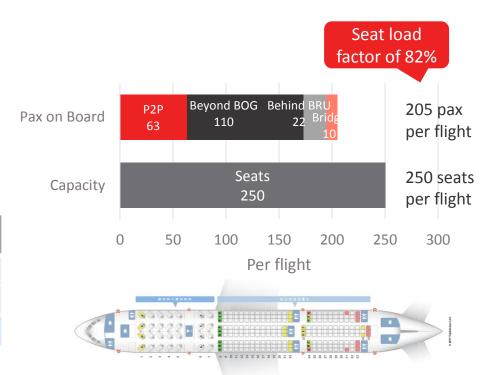

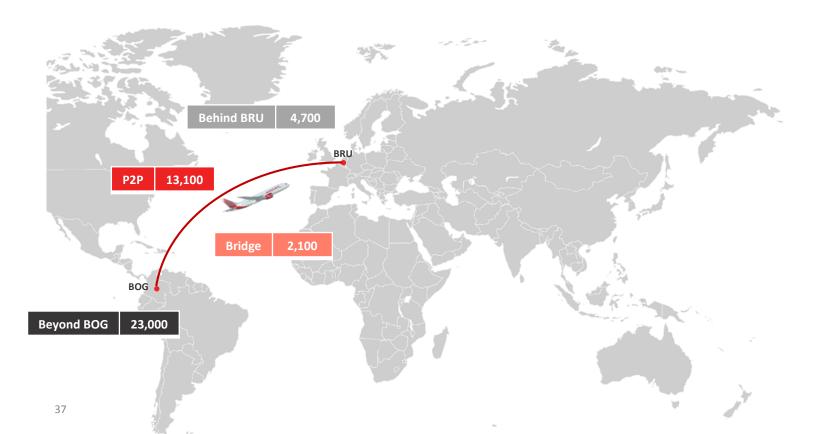

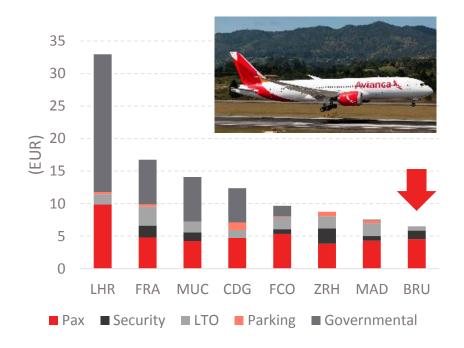


ATTRACTIVE AIRPORT CHARGES

Graph shows a comparison of applicable airport charges at an Avianca **benchmark** of European airports

Graph shows cost for one **typical rotation** of an Avianca B787-8
250 seats, 82% seat load factor, 16% connections, 3hr rotation

Results show airport charges at **Brussels Airport** are lower than at other airports in Europe, close to MAD airport level





NEW ROUTE INCENTIVE PROGRAMME

The Brussels Airport regulated airport charges scheme includes an attractive

New Route Incentive Programme

- Incentive is a fixed (EUR) amount per departing passenger
- Calculation after the end of each IATA season
- Credited towards future airport charges

Incentive rebate over 3 years for a new BRU – BOG route would amount to **1.2m EUR**

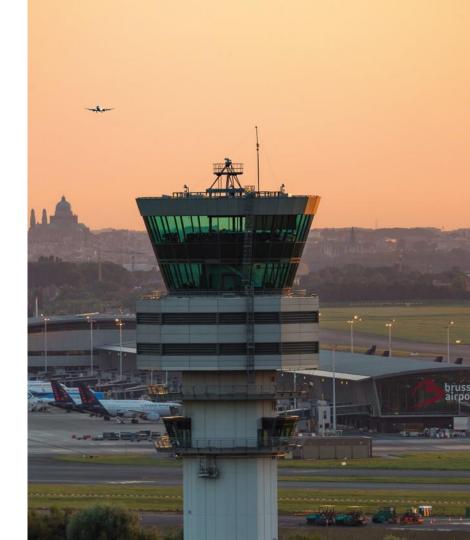
BRUSSELS AIRPORT: THE HEART OF EUROPE
